

## Finding the Right Words

Finding words you are comfortable with will help you communicate more effectively with partner(s) about your needs and desires. The diagrams below have common and scientific names for various genital parts. For each part, what word do you like? What word does your partner like?

While there are literally 1,000s of words for various body parts, the lists below begin with the common name and give popular alternatives.

### External anatomy




Public Mound: FUPA (fatty upper pubic area), pubes, mound, front buns

Clitoris: Clit, button, bean, taco dj

Inner and Outer Lips: Beef curtains, lips, pink taco, lady bits, fuzzy mimosa

Vaginal Opening: clam, quim, lady cave, va-jay-jay

Anus: butt hole, hole, back door, number two, Mormon/Catholic loophole



Penis: dick, cock, pee pee, johnson, shaft

Scrotum and testicles: balls, boys, choda, family jewels

Prostate: fun button, men's g-spot

Anus: hole, butthole, balloon knot, corn hole

### Sex Acts and Kink Play

Penis in vaginal penetration: sex, P in V, dicking down, penetrative sex, sharing your "gift"

Penis in anus penetration: butt sex, anal, using the back door, corn holing, fudge packing

Stimulating genitals with fingers: fingering, finger blasting, diddling, middle schooling

Stimulating genitals with mouth/tongue: oral, oral sex, muff diving, going down, giving head

Consensual hitting: impact play, flogging, beating, spanking, caning

Consensual tying up: bondage, rope, shibari, suspension

### **Other Body Parts & Fluids:**

Breast: chest, boobs/boobies, fun bags, titties, the girls, hooters, sweater puppies

Buttocks: Butt, bottom, peach emoji, truck, caboose, tushie, badonkadonk

Ejaculate: cum, sperm, jizz, goo, skeet, nut, manmilk

Vaginal secretions: wet, squirting, snail trail, girl gravy

### **Roles**

Dominant: top, D-type, left of the slash, Daddy, Dom

Submissive: bottom, S-type, right of the slash, sub, pet

Switch: undetermined, fluid

## Addressing Your Partner

What you call your partner during intimate moments can change from the day-to-day way you address them. Some people enjoy using honorifics (Sir, Ma'am); some have pet names; some use derogatory terms consensually during sex. It is important to talk about what terms are okay for you and your partner(s) and what are not.

Never assume a specific term is acceptable. Make sure to ask before using any of the following:

**Familial relationship terms** (Daddy, Mommy, Baby Girl, Boy, Little One, etc.)

**Honorifics** (Sir, Ma'am, Mistress, Master, etc.)

**Derogatory Language** (Slut, Ho, Cum Dumpster, Bitch, etc.)

These terms can cause a strong emotional reaction in a person you may or may not want to trigger. Having a conversation first prevents missteps.
